Wakf Act, 1955	 Why in news? A contentious bill to amend 44 sections of the Waqf Act of 1995 - including changing it to ensure representation of non-Muslim individuals and Muslim women in central and state Waqf bodies - is likely to be tabled in the Lok Sabha. Key Points: Under the Waqf Act of 1954, a Waqf refers to a property dedicated in the name of God for religious and charitable purposes. It is the permanent dedication by a Muslim of any movable or immovable property for purposes recognised by Muslim law as pious, religious, or charitable. Waqfs in India are regulated by the Waqf Act, 1995. Waqf Act 1995: It is comprehensive legislation enacted by the Indian government to improve the administration and management of waqf properties. It establishes the Central Waqf Council and State Waqf Boards, distributing powers


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Socio Economic Outlook for 2024-25, reflecting a strong economy and dynamic workforce.

Key Findings:

- The Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) was 66.5 percent, higher than the national average of 61.6 percent.
- Higher female LFPR at 50.4 percent, compared to the national average of 39.8 per cent.
- The male LFPR is at 81.8 percent, slightly lower than the national level of 83.2 percent.
- The WPR (percentages of people employed), was 63.4 percent above the national average of 59.5 percent.
- The rural unemployment rate was 3 percent against the national average of 2.7 per cent, the urban unemployment rate was at 8 percent, compared to the national average of 5.7 percent.
- Agriculture remains the largest employer, engaging 47.3 percent of all working adults, the services sector and industries sector follow, employing 33 percent and **19.7 percent** of the workforce, respectively.



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
