	 Dynasty. The dynasty reigned over modern-day Odisha and portions of West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, and Chhattisgarh. It was established by Indravarma I after defeating Vishnu Kundin Indra Bhattaraka. The capital was at Kalinganagar or Mukhalingam and reached its zenith under King Anantavarman Chodaganga.
NIRF Ranking 2024	 Why in news? Recently, NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) 2024 has been released.
	 Key Points: The National Institutional Ranking Framework(NIRF) is a methodology adopted by the Ministry of Education, to rank institutions of higher education in India. Three institutes of the state, including KL University (40), Andhra University (41), and Acharya Nagarjuna University (97) found a place in top 100 institutions of the country.
UNHRC (United Nations Human Rights Council)	 Why in news? Andhra Pradesh deputy chief minister Pawan Kalyan has appealed to UNHRC (United Nations Human Rights Council) to protect the country's vulnerable sections.
	 Key Points: It is an intergovernmental body within the United Nations whose mission is to promote and protect human rights around the world. It was created by the General Assembly on 15 March 2006. It has 47 members elected for staggered three-year terms on a regional group basis.
Places in news: Tungabhadra Dam	 Why in news? Recently Tunghabadra dam in Karnataka malfunctioned, leading to flood risks in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh.

	 Key Points: Tungabhadra Dam, also known as Pampa Sagar, is a multipurpose dam constructed across the Tungabhadra River, a tributary of the Krishna River. Tunga Bhadra reservoir has a storage capacity of 101 TMC with a catchment area spreading to 28000 sq. km. The dam is about 49.5 meters in height and has about 33 crest gates. Tungabhadra River is a major river in the south Indian peninsula. It is the largest tributary of the Krishna River.
