INS Arighaat	 Why in news? Recently, India's second nuclear powered ballistic submarine INS Arighaat gets commissioned into Indian Navy in Visakhapatnam.
	 Key Points: The second Arihant-Class submarine 'INS Arighaat' is an upgraded variant of the Arihant-class submarine and expected to be armed with K-15 ballistic missiles, each with a range of 750-km. It is built under the Advanced Technology Vessel project at the Ship Building Centre in Visakhapatnam.
Indigenous plants species	 Why in news? Recently, the Forest Department has recommended growing 25 indigenous plant species as part of an afforestation drive.
	 Key Points: Indigenous plants, also known as native plants, are plants that have evolved naturally in a specific region, ecosystem, or habitat without human influence.
